Dear Susan,

I know you want to visit London soon. Here is some advice about public transport in London. If you don't have a car, you can travel by bus, underground, train and taxi.

The Underground is old but fast, and there are lots of lines you can use. You need to buy a ticket to use it. A lot of Londoners use the Underground – about one million a day.

If you want to see the city, you can go by bus, train or taxi. You can buy a map of bus routes, which will help you a lot (there is also a map of Underground lines). There are a lot of bus routes which will take you to many of London's tourist attractions.

And taxis? There are two kinds of taxis in London. The first ones are called "black cabs" – they usually stand at the railway stations or you can hail them in the street. The second ones are called "mini cabs" – you should ask the fare before you use them.
